Ocean Journey

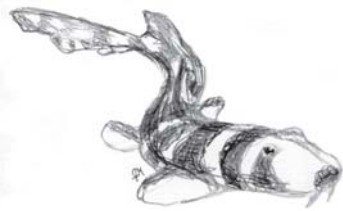
Tropical Cove

2. Name two kinds of shark species found at Shark Island.

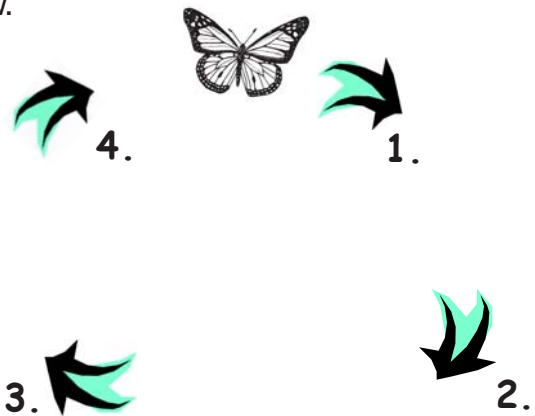
Fun Fact

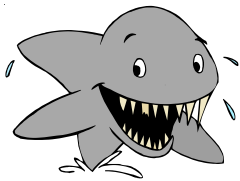
Gentoo penguins are fast swimmers. They can swim underwater at speeds of 20 miles per hour!

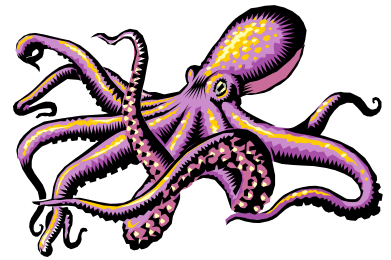

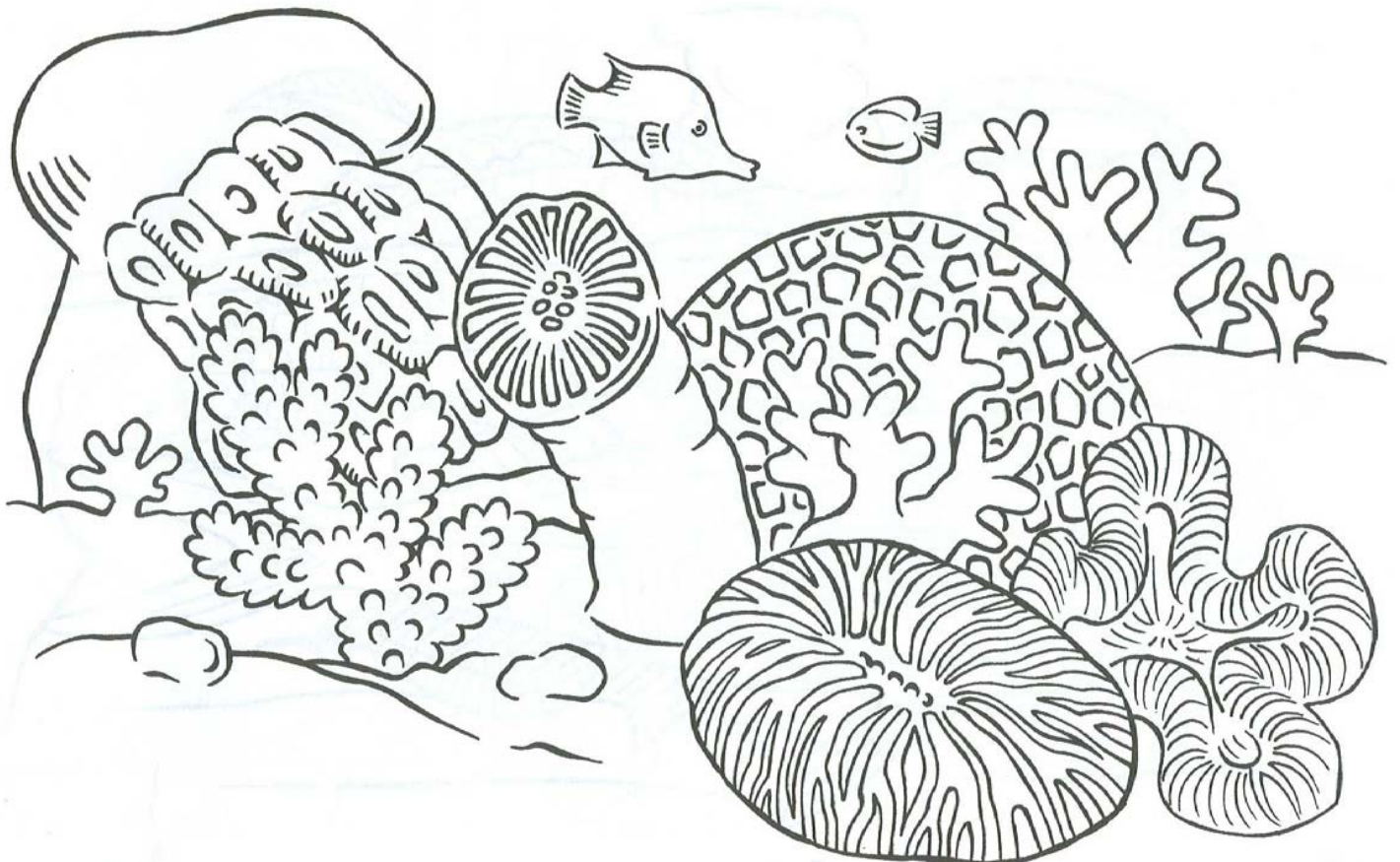

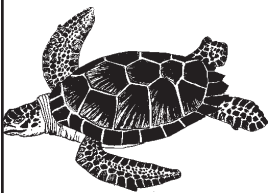
Our American Alligator lies really still in the water so she can surprise her food when it swims by!

The green moray eel is really a blue fish covered with a coat of yellow slime.

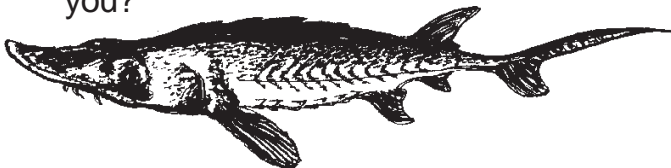
Rivers of the World

23. In the Reelfoot Lake Exhibit, find a fish with a large paddle-shaped nose. Write its name and draw a picture of it.

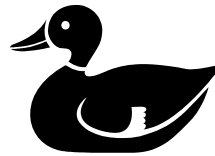


24. Find a salamander in the Tennessee River exhibit. Write its name.

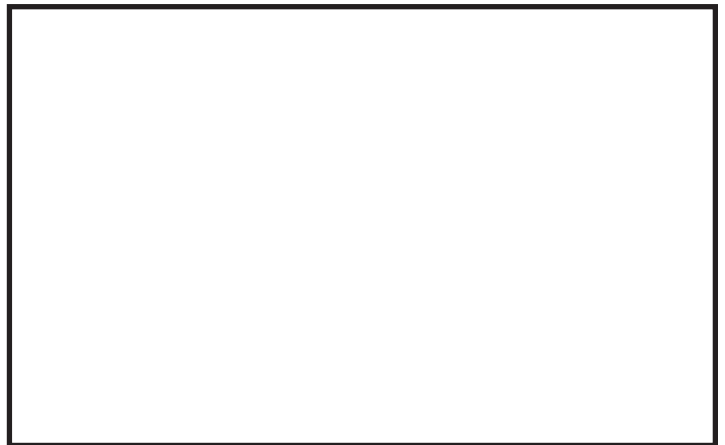
25. How do red salamanders get oxygen?
